

Two of our most beloved elephants, Doe (Gee Bloh) and Darling (Bong Kong), are at risk of being taken away, torn from their forest sanctuary and sent back into the world of close-contact tourism or a new city life. After everything they've been through, this can't be the end of their story.

We're launching an urgent campaign to Save the Soul Sisters: A Forever Home for Doe & Darling. We must raise \$70,000 to secure their long-term care and protect them from being sold or relocated.

The Story of Doe and Darling: A Lifelong Bond and a Second Chance



Doe (Gee Bloh) and Darling (Bong Kong) are two extraordinary elephants whose lives have been deeply entwined for decades. Hailing from the remote village of Memong in Mondulkiri, Cambodia, these gentle giants spent most of their lives working in traditional community forestry—hauling timber, transporting goods, and supporting village life.

Now estimated to be in their 50s and 60s, Doe and Darling were lovingly cared for by an elder in their village, a man who lost his eyesight many years ago. For decades, his family upheld a deep cultural and spiritual bond with the elephants, treating them with respect and kindness uncommon in a world where elephants are often exploited. But as generations changed, so did their circumstances.

Over time, family disputes and economic hardship forced the elephants into more commercial work, including logging and tourism. Their health and wellbeing began to suffer, especially for Doe, who struggled with anxiety and fear in new environments. Recognizing their declining condition, the family sought support—and in 2012, the pair first arrived at Elephant Valley Project (EVP) for a much-needed rest.

At EVP, Doe and Darling began to thrive. Surrounded by forest, experienced mahouts, and compassionate care, they rediscovered what it means to be elephants—roaming freely, forming social bonds, and healing from their past.

Though their initial stay ended when they were returned to the village due to family tensions, they came back to EVP in 2017 for a second, longer rest period. Tragically, their beloved grandfather passed away during this time. Since then, the family has struggled to care for them, and the elephants have faced increasing external pressures.

In 2021, a dramatic and alarming event highlighted these growing threats: Doe and Darling were nearly stolen from their owners by parties seeking to sell them into close-contact tourism in the city. Despite having very limited resources during the global COVID-19 pandemic, EVP intervened to help the owners recover the elephants. We raised funds to cover transport and veterinary care, underscoring the sanctuary's commitment to protecting them even in the most difficult times.

Following this ordeal, the owners agreed to sign a five-year contract with EVP, ensuring Doe and Darling could live safely and peacefully at the sanctuary—away from exploitation and the risks of the dwindling wild elephant population in Cambodia.

Today, Doe and Darling continue to live under this agreement, sharing a deep and enduring bond. Darling, graceful and self-assured, remains fiercely protective of her more sensitive best friend, Doe, who has blossomed from a nervous, mistrustful elephant into a symbol of resilience.

This story is more than just a tale of two elephants—it reflects the urgent challenges facing Cambodia's elephants and the families who care for them. By supporting their permanent rescue, you help preserve not only their futures but also the legacy of compassion and respect they represent.
